

NOTICE OF MODIFICATION ORDER
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981
DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT OF RIGHTS OF WAY FOR SHROPSHIRE
THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH ADDITION, TOWN OF SHREWSBURY)
MODIFICATION ORDER 2019

The above named Order made on 28th November 2019 by The Shropshire Council ("the Council") if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by:-

adding a footpath from point A on the order map (SJ 50981 5517) where it leaves the County Road known as Roselyn and runs in a general south easterly direction along an alleyway between numbers 32 and 34 Roselyn for approximately 45 metres and then turns to run in a general east-south-easterly direction continuing along the alleyway between numbers 73 and 75 Corndon Crescent for a further 42 metres approximately to exit on the County Road known as Corndon Crescent at point B on the order map (SJ 5106 1512); a total distance of approximately 87 metres with a width of 1.5 metres at point A on the order map, a width of 0.9 metres at point B on the order map and a width of 1.4 metres between point A and point B on the order Map.

A copy of the Order and the Order map may be seen free of charge at the Council offices at The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury during normal office hours. Copies of the Order and map may also be bought from the Shropshire Council at the above address at a price of £6.50.

Any representation or objection relating to the Order must be sent in writing to Rights of Way Mapping and Enforcement Manager, Shropshire Outdoor Partnerships, The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury, SY2 6ND or by email to outdoor.recreation@shropshire.gov.uk not later than 17th January 2020 and you are requested to state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or to any part of it, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State (or part of it if the Council has by notice to Secretary of State so elected under paragraph 5 of Schedule 15 to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981) may itself confirm the Order (or that part of the Order). If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs in whole or in part, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
