Based in Shropshire, SYA has been providing services for young people for over 35 years. These services are delivered to over 4,000 young people, aged 11-18, serving as many as 3,000 through affiliated clubs every week.

This is achieved through a collection of youth groups, clubs and activities.

Youth clubs are typically free of charge but in some cases a small donation of £1 per session is asked only from those who can afford it.

Our term time weekly clubs offer an array of physical and sports activity such as tag archery and rugby, tennis, dodgeball, Just Dance, Sumo football and termly trips to locations like climbing walls, bowling and ice skating.

In order to help ease the increasing problem presented by food poverty, a weekly food based activity is always offered where young people are encouraged to learn how to cook healthy foods.

SYA also works with schools and external agencies to give young people extra opportunities such as Health Champions, Young Leaders, UK Youth Parliament, early intervention mental health sessions and specialist groups for young people with SEND needs and those who are part of the LGBTQAI+ Community.

SYA aims for young people to have access to quality, affordable and appropriate provisions and ultimately wants young people to feel valued, seen and heard.

SYA is commissioned by Shropshire Council and Tier 2 town and parish councils across Shropshire. £295,578 of income in 2022/23 was received from 20 government contracts and £1,500 from 1 government grant, allowing us to run our clubs with the legal staffing requirements.

Additional funding is raised through fundraising activities, other local grant funding, events and legacy income. This money is utilised to grow our provisions and to purchase items over and above to give the young people the best possible experience.

SYA is currently in the process of building a much needed new headquarters following a gratefully received large grant from the Government's Youth Investment Fund.

The headquarters will house the admin team, training facilities but more importantly a space for the young people to call their own.

The building will be given to us completely empty with an outdoor area which we intend to adapt into an inclusive and useable space for its new occupants.

At the existing site, we have always had an outside space dedicated for use by young people to grow, learn about plants and connect with nature. We would like to continue this valuable experience when we move back in and are asking for your financial support to allow us to rebuild the area which has been lost to the groundworks.

We would like to install raised planters that are built in a way that allows people using a wheelchair to access them.

We will need plants, bulbs, seeds and soil to fill the planters and tools to help with this. Foods grown from the planters such as apples, tomatoes and herbs can all be used as part of our food provision giving the young people an insightful experience as to where healthy food comes from and to equip them with skills needed to continue this in later life.

Flowers planted will educate young people on the benefits of insects within our environment as well as providing pit stops, shelter and food for these insects that pass through the area.

This project will be especially valuable to our All Together Now group for young people with SEND needs as access will be easier for those needing mobility aids.

We have found many young people who attend our clubs enjoy seeing things grow, harvesting produce and using the produce for cooking. They find it rewarding being

part of group activities which they may not have access to otherwise.

Past experience has shown this is a rewarding activity for our young people.

As part of our regular youth club provision, we have learned that gardening and harvesting produce can offer many physical and emotional benefits. It promotes life skills like responsibility and teamwork, improves environmental and sustainability awareness while encouraging a healthy lifestyle through physical activity and access to freshly grown food. The initiative also provides entrepreneurial opportunities, enhances artistic expression, and offers therapeutic benefits, making it a holistic approach to youth development and community well-being.

This project will benefit local residents for as long as it is allowed to continue. Young people who attend the club will develop lifelong skills around gardening and producing their own food and we hope will foster a love of cooking with fresh fruit and vegetables that they have grown.

Shropshire Council have granted us a least of 99 years upon return to the new building so we hope we can provide this service for many years to come.

We currently have 12 young people attending our All Together Now group and almost 70 young people attending the other groups on offer. Our work with the HAF project sees around 30 young people attending the Lodge during school holidays so we envisage numbers of over 100 attending regularly.

SYA Youth workers provide termly reports of activities, successes, and concerns around their allocated youth clubs. These reports include information on what has been done to increase / improve physical and emotional health, notes on common areas of concern to young people such as bullying, physical and mental health concerns and family issues. Case studies and variation to service are also reported on.

We know attending our clubs positively impacts the family unit as a whole so by multiplying our number of attendees by the average family size of 2.4, we predict that the number of local residents to benefit will be as many as 269.
