The Hive is a valued town centre venue used by an average of 300 people of all ages from the local community each week. We hire the venue spaces to a variety of local groups for activities such as: Shropshire Youth Theatre (2 x per week), Shrewsbury Town Centre youth group (2 x per week), life drawing, Shropshire Jazz Network, Shrewsbury Film Society, Taking Part disco/music nights for adults with learning disabilities, Shropshire Inclusive Dance and Shropshire Architects, as well as running an open access café and gallery space with exhibitions held throughout the year.

In addition, the Hive programmes our own activities including popular weekly under 5s music sessions Buzzy Beats, regularly sold-out Folk gigs, workshops for young people with mental health issues and workshop programmes for children and young people in a range of art-forms including pottery, music, art & craft, film, animation, and photography during school holidays.

The Hive delivers social impact projects for vulnerable groups through creativity, especially for children and young people. We run funded projects in partnership with local (Shrewsbury-based) organisations working with looked after children, young carers, LGBTQ+ young people,

Pupil Referral Units, refugees & asylum-seekers, as well as children and young people in healthcare settings (e.g., NHS mental health services and siblings of oncology patients through Hope House Hospice).

We currently reach over 2,500 children, young people, and young adults annually through music, media, and creative arts-based workshops.

We do not require a subscription fee and the venue is open Tuesday-Friday 9.30am-4.30pm, as well as for frequent events and room bookings during weekdays, evenings, and weekends.

The Hive has a Board of Trustees and, since 2018 we have had a Creative Advisory Board; a creative steering committee comprised of well-connected arts professionals. The Advisory Board advises, supports, and guides the organisation, influencing development of the Charity's creative vision and strategy. World-renowned and locally based comic illustrator Charlie Adlard became the Hive's first Patron in 2019.

Q7 What is your primary source of funding?

Most of our income comes from delivering charitable activities which incorporated a total value of £206,599 for the year-end 2022 and included funds from; Arts Council England; Shropshire Council; National Lottery Community Fund; Children in Need; Youth Music Foundation, St. James's Place Foundation, and National Lottery Heritage Fund. Legacies and donations equated to £84,620 and trading totalled £46,949 (including cafe income; ticket income; gift aid, and room hire).

The Hive's kitchen and café is a much-utilised space to serve children, young people, and young adults on our wellbeing projects, youth clubs, and audiences of our events. Unfortunately, The Hive's kitchen/ café-bar area is looking very tired and in need of improvement and re-decoration after many years of daily use. We would like to give this space a lift, with new worktops, counter-frontage, covered storage, and fresh paint on the walls. Being a small space, it's imperative that the storage works well for us and fulfils the different needs of the kitchen/ café-bar for our events, some of which can frequently bring 100-150 people through the building in a busy 2-4-hour period, sometimes multiple times in a day/night to enjoy gigs, workshops, events, cinema, gallery exhibitions, and parties. As well as the café-bar serving refreshments and snacks for groups coming through the building, the kitchen serves as a communal space for The Hive's staff team, freelance workforce, and hirers of our spaces to make hot drinks and lunches etc, so it is well-utilised and in need of significant updating.

We have received additional funding through National Lottery Awards for All towards the materials, labour, and a new glasswasher to complete the space.

We are also seeking funding to help keep our weekly early years music and movement workshops going. Using percussion instruments, their bodies, and voices they fill the morning with sound and song each Friday during term-time.

Despite some busy and even oversubscribed periods in the academic year, the sessions can also go through quieter times, where the artist fee and travel, and the staff time and resources used for the session, certainly don't reach break-even. As a community organisation, we feel we have a moral obligation to keep on offering these wonderful sessions to our local community, helping parents/guardians and carers of infants and toddlers to socialise, as well as giving these young children the chance to be involved in a fun session which enables them to socialise with other little ones, develop their dexterity and hand-eye coordination, learn rhythm and make lots of noise! Parents and carers who come tell us that the sessions are a lifeline for them, getting them out of the house, and giving them the time to sit and chat over a coffee after each workshop too. The connections built through Buzzy Beats have helped to form new friendships and support groups, tackling the isolation and overwhelm that new parenthood can bring about.

The Hive is a charity with our local community at the heart of everything we do. Our venue is used throughout the year by groups using The Hive for their community events.

The kitchen/café-bar has not been updated in over 15 years and is looking dilapidated after many years of daily use. As a space so regularly used and much-loved by many local groups, it feels that the least we can do is try and raise the funds to improve it.

The improvement work can be completed relatively quickly, so we expect it to be completed within 3 months of receiving the funds, subject to the availability of carpenter/s and decorators. In addition, the purchase of new storage and fixtures/fittings can be made as soon as the funds are received.

The Hive keeps monitoring of people using the building, attending projects, events, training, and conferences here. The kitchen/ café-bar are utilised for most of these events. We will measure the increased footfall/room hire and number of events.

Based on the amount of young people who take part in our projects each year-approximately 2,500 we expect that most of these will utilise the café-bar/kitchen during this time.

We keep monitoring figures for our Buzzy Beats sessions, and our workshop leader Mary Keith evaluates the sessions.

This will be challenging for our charity in the current climate due to the cost-of-living crisis causing funding pressures and rising bills. If needed we'd delay work to the kitchen area, however these basic changes are much needed at present.

Q14 Sustainability

What plans do you have in place to ensure that your organisation becomes more sustainable and less reliant on grant funding, particularly from the Town Council?

Currently The Hive is looking to apply to Arts Council England and National Lottery for larger strategic grants to help support our core costs, and also to enable The Hive to employ an in-house fundraising manager. Having a fundraising manager on payroll will help us to establish a robust sustainability plan.

We aim to get ourselves to a position where The Hive is much less reliant on grantfunding. We were in a much stronger position and heading for financial sustainability pre-pandemic, so we are working very hard to get back to this place again as a charity.

Despite the current cost-of-living and funding pressures, The Hive is making some inroads into financial security and sustainability by developing income generating plans for the venue through room hire for corporate and community events and activities, ensuring we work to a full cost recovery business model on most of our projects. This way we can see a way to building charity reserves again in the future and planning for future growth for the organisation.
