Since the last Recreation and Leisure meeting several large events have taken place including the 80's concerts, Baton relay and flower show.

The 80s concerts had attendances in the region of 10,000 for Friday and 13,000 for Saturday. Due to the hot weather and the fact that we were preparing for the Baton relay some reasonable adjustments had to be made for the working arrangements, such as starting earlier in the day providing the activities were not noisy.

The UK Live team worked extremely hard to ensure the Quarry was left in an excellent condition and fit for the Baton relay on the Monday.

Although the Monday was the hottest day of the year, the baton relay was well attended, and a good time was had by all.

The flower show went ahead after an absence due to the covid crisis. Unfortunately, there was a train strike on the Saturday, and the weather was extremely hot again over the two days resulting in the cancellation of the fireworks which did result in a reduction in attendances. The show struggled to find contractors for marquees, caterers and some of the trade stalls, however with a lot of dedication, they managed to ensure the show did go on.

Considering the size of the events and the disruption caused in the Quarry, the number of complaints was far less than previous years, with complaints consisting of one noise complaint, one complaint about vehicle reversing alarms, one regarding the times the work men were starting and finishing work and one comment about disability access.

The list is constantly changing with either cancellations or activities taking advantage of the spaces created in the diary.

All activities are currently complying with COVID Guidelines and any additional recommendations forthcoming from the Shropshire Council resilience Team must be complied with.
