It is well-known and easily visible from a good distance, always in exactly the same place. Not sure if anyone is actually caught speeding as a result. More locations and more often please, particularly in the short section of Wenlock Rd between Column roundabout and the junction with Sutton Rd.	Visibility is essential.
