ONSITE CONSULTATION

Notes based on conversations during the first round of engagement, comprising two events –

- 8am to 6pm, Wednesday 25 February 2026 : engaging all interested visitors to the green space
- 1:30pm to 4pm, Sunday 1 March 2026 : engaging particularly SAHA people, based around a football match

The six presentation boards were mounted on the MUGA fence and were helpful to inform the discussion.

All people who took part in these conversations were encouraged to respond to the online questionnaire, accessed via the STC website.

The points made here represent a range of views of individuals, therefore they are diverse and sometimes conflicting, all of which is as expected.

The findings of these on-site discussions will sit beside the substantial amount of information collected via the online questionnaire.



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Accessibility, Paths, Circulation, Drainage

- Better paths needed, all around the park
- There needs to be many more seats, spread out around the park.
- Drainage is a problem in many places, with muddy areas.
- Grass paths are not ok most of the year.
- Good to have two proper corner entrances on Shelton Drive.
- A 1km running / walking loop is a good idea.
- The football pitch needs better drainage.
- Some people on Meadow Gardens have a back garden gate into the park, which is great, raises use of the green space.
- The name of the place is important in attracting people, creating the right identity.
- Better signage needed at all entrances.
- The park does not feel very accessible.
- Mixed feelings about the benefits of pedestrian access direct from Shorncliffe Way

Lighting

- Lighting might be good on main path along the edge.
- Now most people just use head torches, generally accepted as ok.
- The lighting at the Quarry is not great, needs to be better than that.
- Low level lighting or no lighting at all.
- On balance, best to have no lighting, not really needed.

Dog Walkers

- This is the main use for the space now.
- It is essential that this is a central part of the future park.
- There is an important social aspect, for dogs and humans.

- Paths need improvements, as above.
- More dog poo bins are needed, two is not enough locations.
- There should be more places to sit, and shelters for when it rains.
- The football pitch should be fenced off from dogs.

Teenagers

- A shelter for teenagers to hang out would be good, it would help to know where they are gathered.
- ...But the covered space would be difficult to manage, would encourage ASB.
- The only people who leave litter are teenagers.

Adults With Pre School Children

- Play facilities for young children is the biggest opportunity here.
- A play area 'like The Quarry' would be great here.
- Play for young children needs a safe 'soft' play surface.
- Coffee shop, kiosk, van etc would be great.
- Natural sitting areas for example tree stumps.
- Include interpretation of nature for young children.
- Paths should be wider for people with pushchairs.
- Lighting would be better for people with young children.
- Natural play as well as 'monkey bars type equipment'.
- Traffic Park to teach young ones how traffic works.
- Play should be for children of all ages.
- Dogs should be fenced out of play area.

MUGA, Skate Park, Parade Ground

- The MUGA is great, well used.
- The skate park is noisy, can disturb neighbours.
- The skatepark should be much better, should be a much bigger new one on the parade ground, it would be a major attraction, become a destination.
- Is there a proper skate park in Shrewsbury?
- The existing parade ground is terrible, it is pretty much unused for anything, needs to be used for something.
- Could be used for a local market, from time to time.
- Could be used for children's events.

Pump Track Users

- The pump track is very popular
- It should be improved with better maintenance.
- Washroom / toilet would be great, for the number of people who use the track
- The track is much too small, a much larger one should be built in the middle of the park
- We need a smaller pump track for younger children, so much safer for them.
- There have been accidents on the pump track, safety is a problem.
- There is nowhere for parents to sit nearby, when used by younger children.
- The pump track at Mereside is used a lot.

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Range of Facilities

- There is a need for a pétanque pitch. This should include appropriate surfacing, seating and toilets.
- Tennis courts would be good, popular with some people, but most recognise that they could be problematic to manage and benefit few people for the space they take up.
- Outdoor gym, fitness facilities would be well used.
- More exercise facilities for mature / elderly people as well as an outdoor gym.
- An outdoor fitness trail would be good, for a people with range of ability.
- Could there be a community hub building? With toilets.
- It could be keyholder access, with facilities managed by the keyholder group.
- There should be a covered area, a club house with toilets.
- With the right facilities, and parking, the park should become more of a destination.
- People do play football on the grass in the middle.
- Parkour would be great, also adult climbing frames.
- There should be more facilities that girls are more comfortable with, eg. roller blading, roller skating.

Greenery and Planting

- The space should keep a natural character where possible.
- Keep it simple, not over manicured.
- There should be more trees.
- More trees to screen the Shorncliffe back gardens, but not too big.
- Can Shropshire Wildlife Trust be involved in this?
- Include interpretation of nature for young children.

Maintenance, Management

- No point in doing anything unless the park is properly managed, properly funded.
- Generally litter is ok, people clear up litter and broken glass.
- A number of residents from these streets had written down a list of issues. We seek would like to include that document in our record of engagement.
- We list below items discussed that relate directly to the Shorncliffe Way / Shorncliffe Drive location. Other issues made by these residents are covered under other headings.
- The 'Shorncliffe Drive' road signs on Shelton Road should be removed, as previously requested. They serve only to encourage drivers to enter the private road in error, whilst looking for the recreation ground.
- It is essential that the park has a new car park, so that people visit the park, without parking on Shorncliffe Drive or Shorncliffe Way, which has no spare spaces and is already very difficult.
- There should be no pedestrian or cycle access into the green space, via Shorncliffe Way, because this would encourage people to park on these private roads.
- This access might be ok if there is sufficient new parking in the park.
- Parking should be enough for two football teams, a home game could have 30 cars.
- How will the parking be managed?
- Retain the existing railings between the public space and the privately owned green space.
- Who owns the back garden fences?
- Planting of trees (not too big) at the edge of the park will give more privacy to back gardens, houses.
- The green space at the far end of

Shorncliffe Drive is actually called 'Shorncliffe Recreation Ground'. Therefore the public green space should be something different, perhaps Shorncliffe Park, to avoid confusion.

- These residents discussed points on many different issues, which are included under other headings.

Behaviour Generally

- There is some antisocial behaviour, but generally behaviour is ok, best if young people have somewhere to meet, to hang out.
- There is 'low level conflict' between dog walkers and youths having fun, not all generally within accepted norms, generally ok.
- A number of people collect litter, broken glass etc left by others.
- The only people who leave litter are teenagers, otherwise its ok.
- Historically, seats have been removed because of ASB, including fires.
- A more multi-generational place will be more self regulating.
- Most bad behaviour is just because the kids do not have much to do.

Parking, Vehicle Access

- There needs to be parking for events, and for blue badge holders.
- Access for all ages and abilities is important.
- Cars should not be allowed to drive in the park, a bigger car park is needed near the entrance on Shelton Road.
- Parking for events is essential.
- Why are cars allowed in the park?
- There have been five occasions where travellers have accessed the site, it must be secured from traveller access.

Football Team

The following are needed:

- A place to clean boots after the game
- Toilets
- Changing rooms
- Seating
- Parking

Football Coach / Referee

- Another football pitch
- 3-4 all weather pitches with lighting, fences etc (remove existing trees, woods etc?)
- There are no other pitches up at this end of the town
- There is a hockey pitch at Meole Brace, but past its best

Parents of Home / Away Team

- Coffee shop
- Washroom / Toilet
- Basketball court
- Pay for parking but its free on Sunday
- Padel / pickle ball courts

- Meole Brace Pump Track

- QR code used at every opportunity to make easier for consultees to access

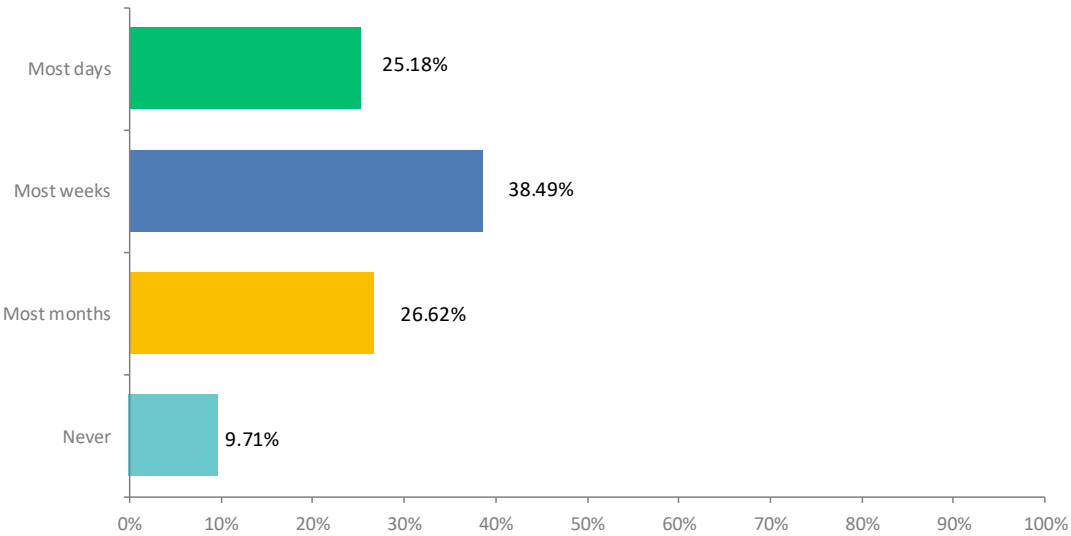
The questions were shaped with three main aims.

The online questionnaire had 282 completed responses. The data from these responses is set out on the following pages.

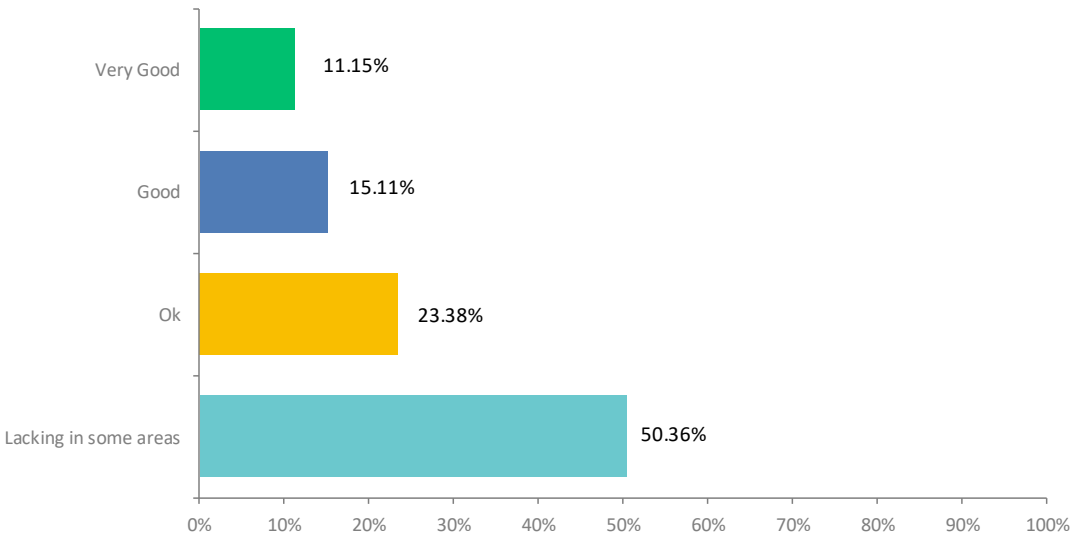
Q1: How often do you use Shorncliffe Rec?

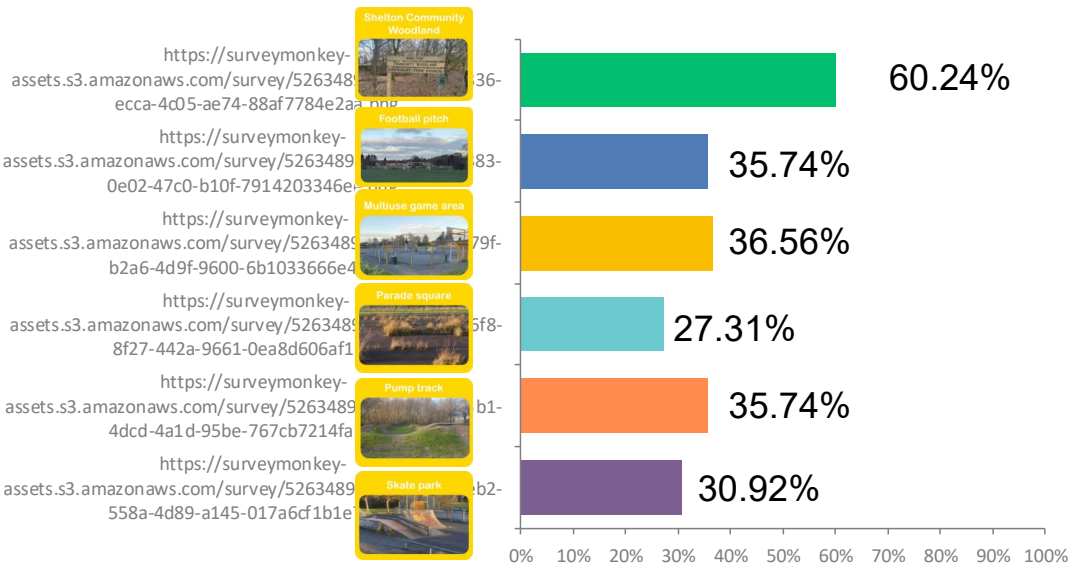
Q2: What do you think of Shorncliffe Rec as a facility for the community?

Q3: Please tell us which facilities you use at Shorncliffe

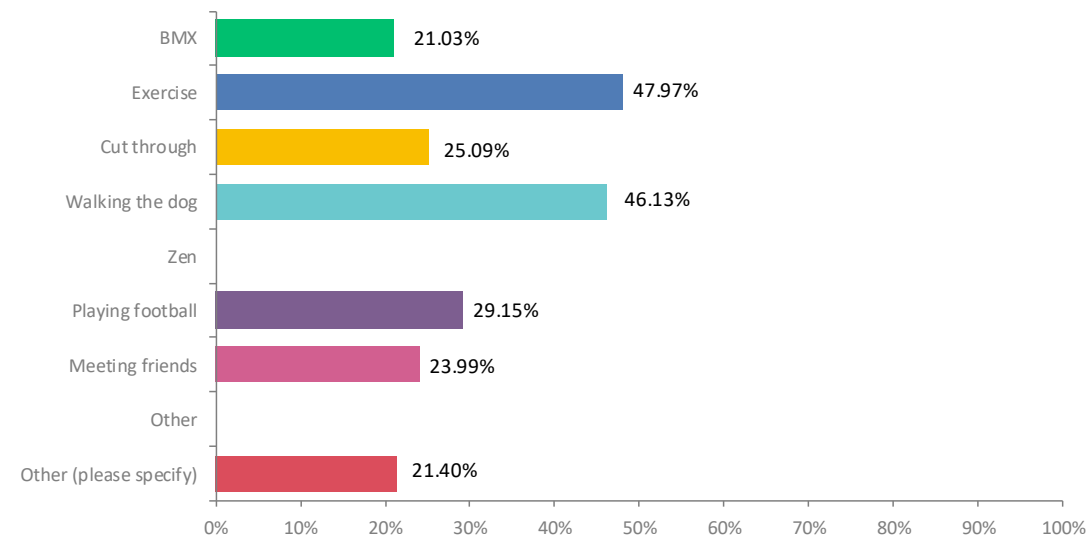

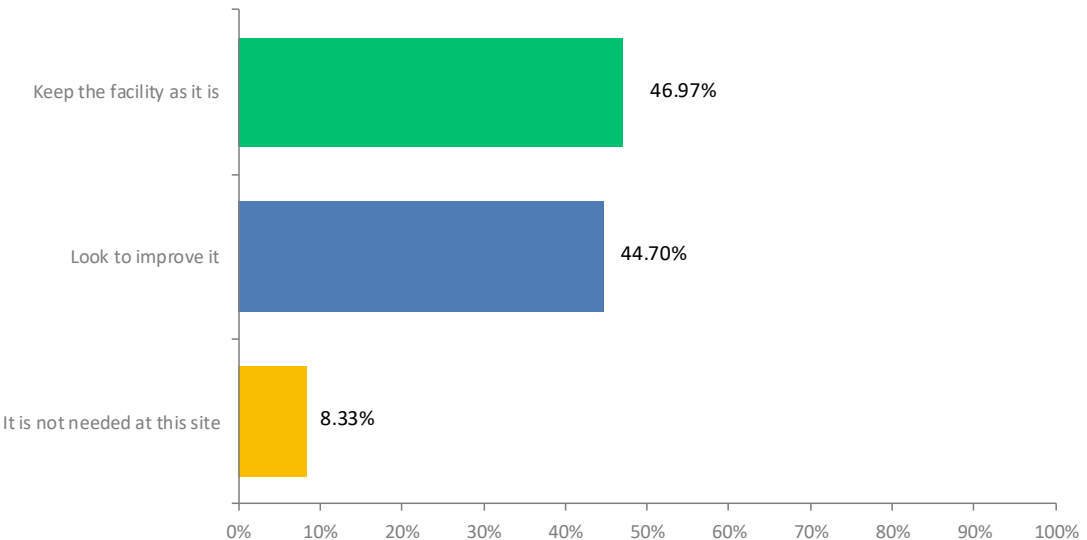
Q5: What do you use the park for? Please tick all that apply

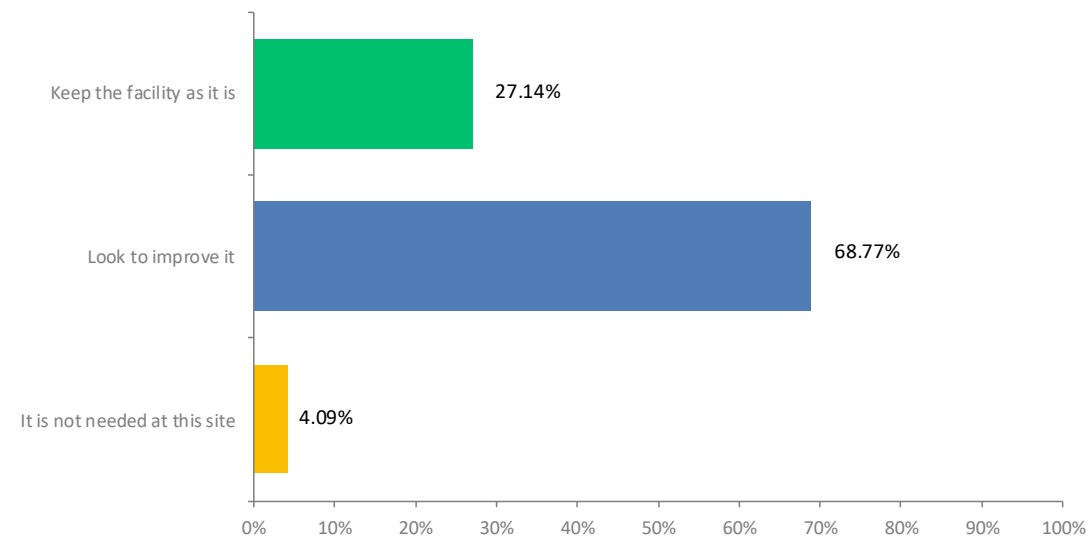
Q6: What are your thoughts on the Football pitch?

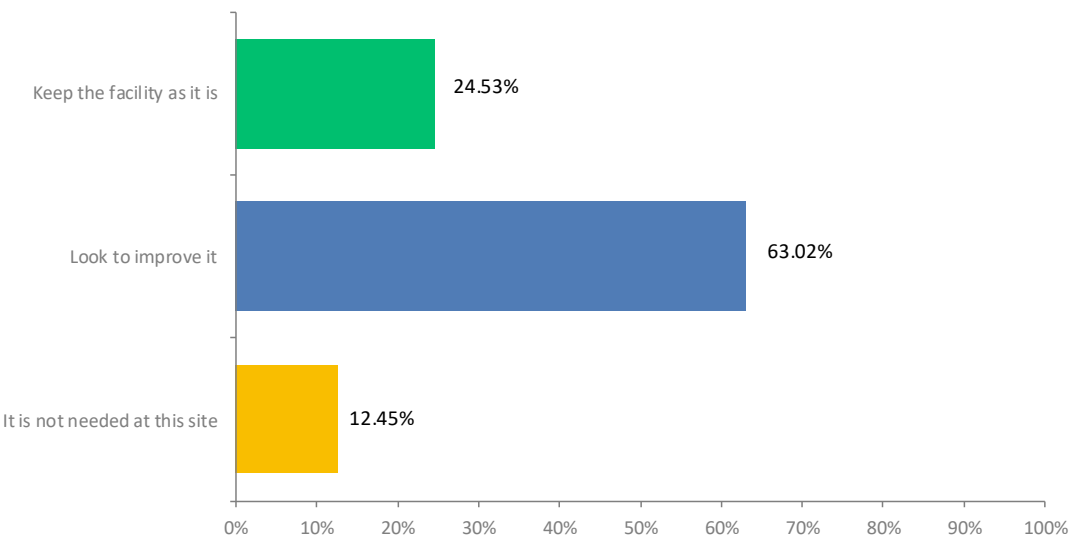
Q7: What are your thoughts on the multi-use games area

Q8: What are your thoughts on the Skatepark?

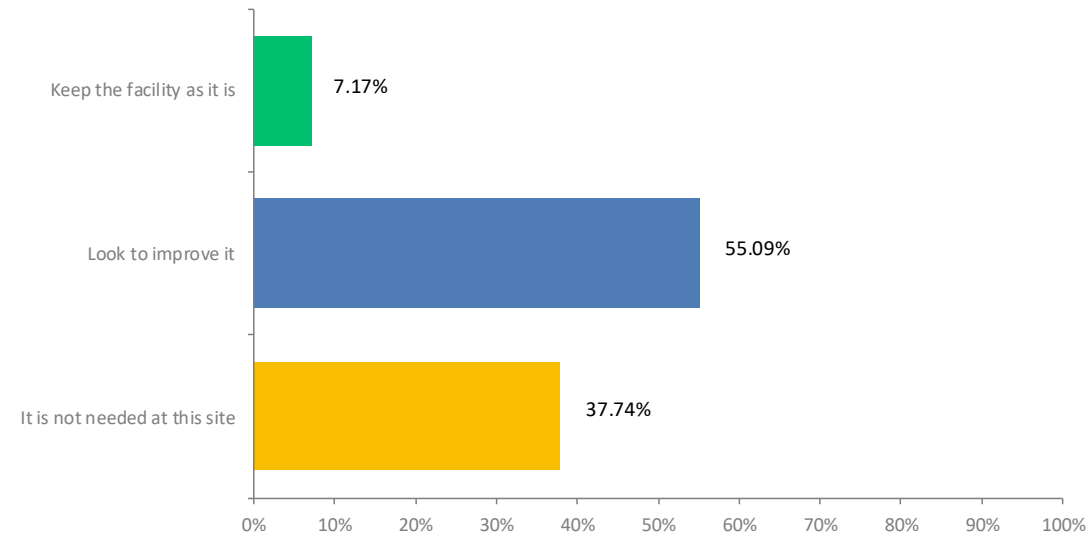

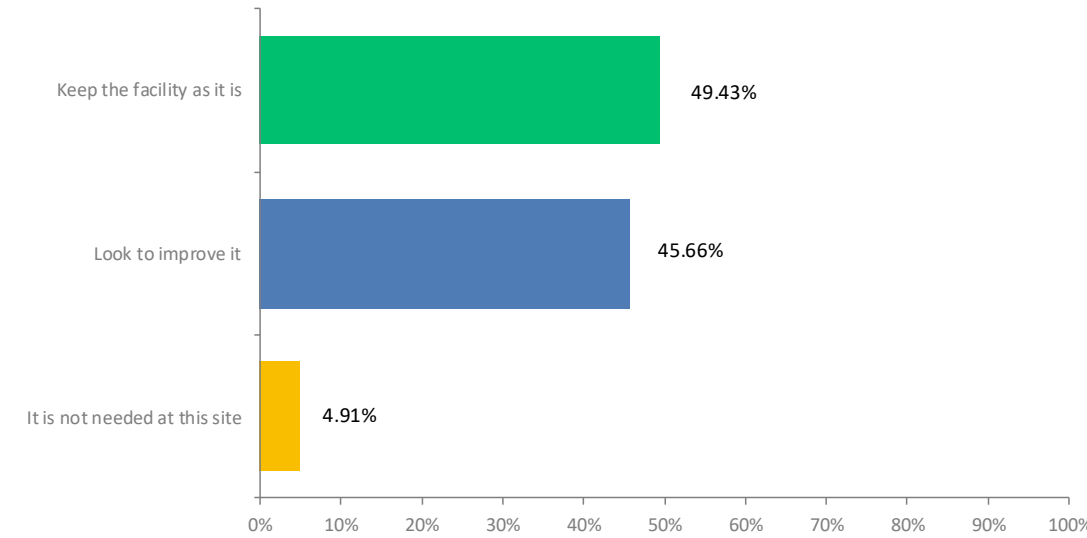
Q9: What are your thoughts on the Parade square?

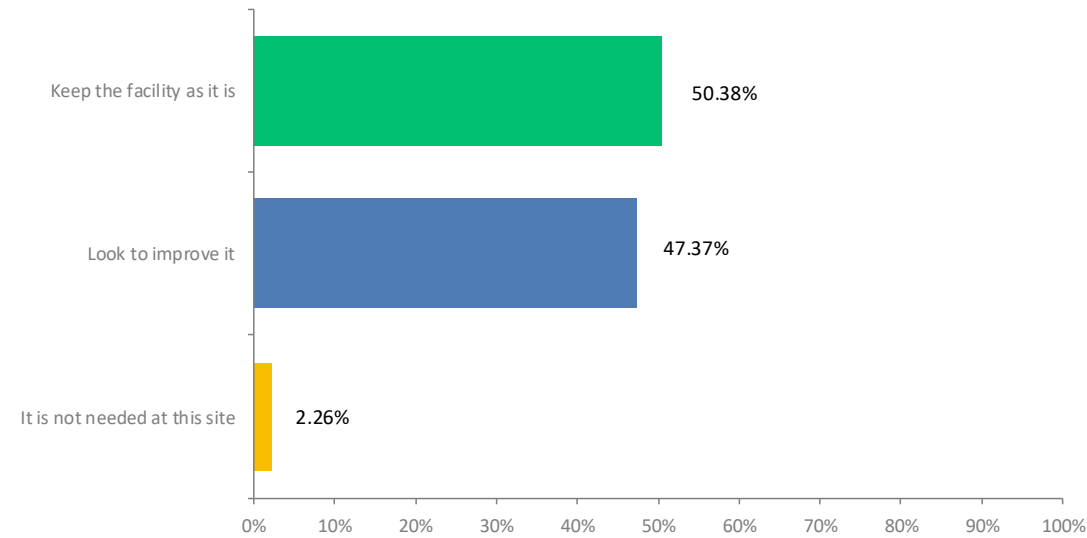
Q10: What are your thoughts on the Pumptrack?

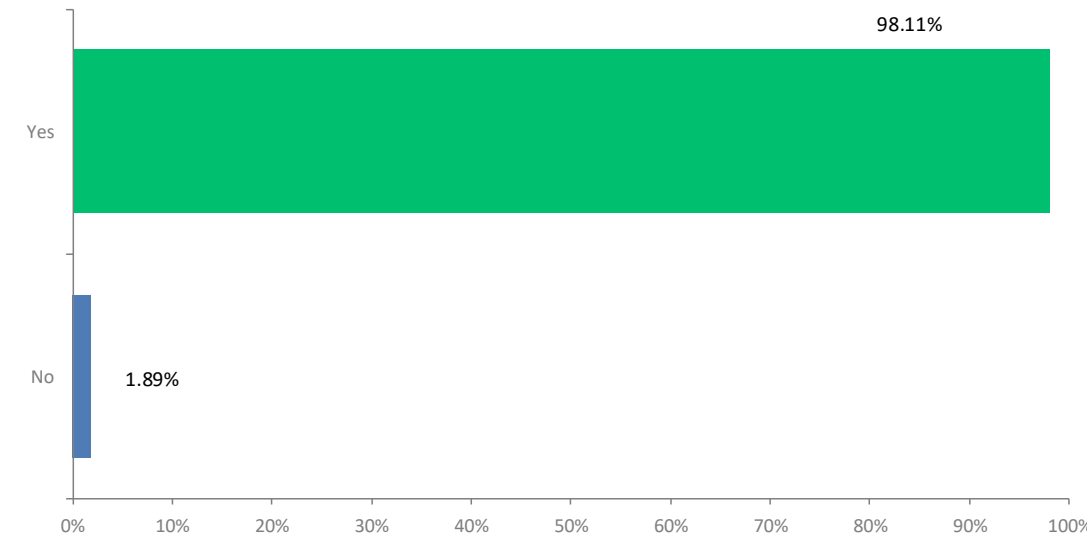
Q11: What are your thoughts on the Community Woodland

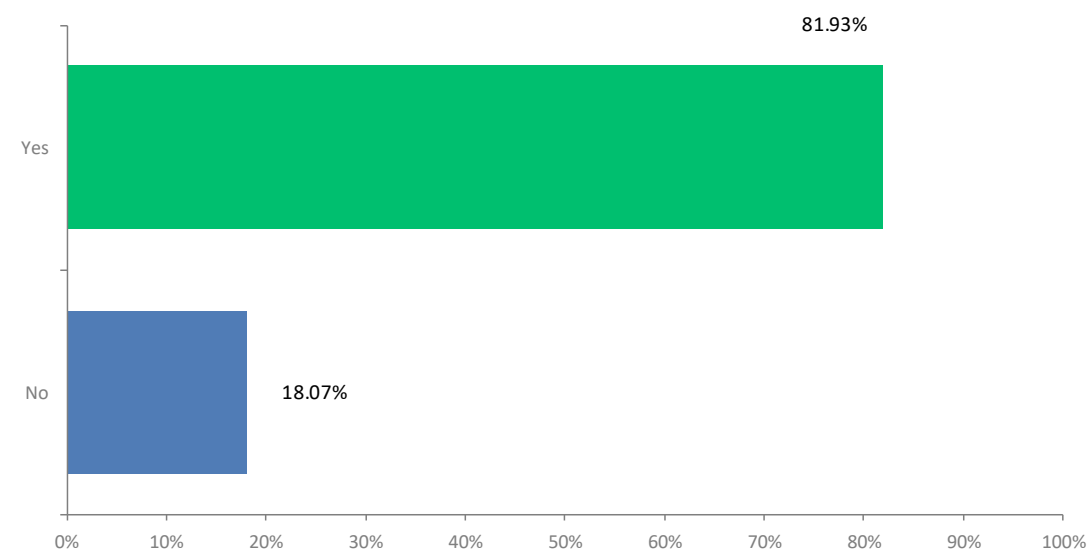
Q17: Should we form new pedestrian entrances on Shelton Road?

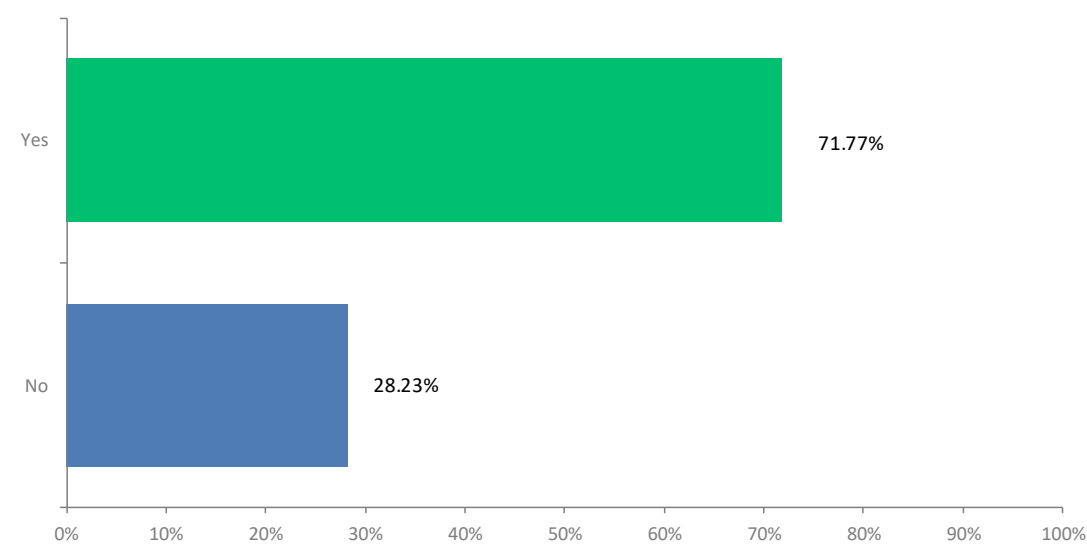
Q18: Should we enhance the existing pedestrian entrance on Shelton Road?

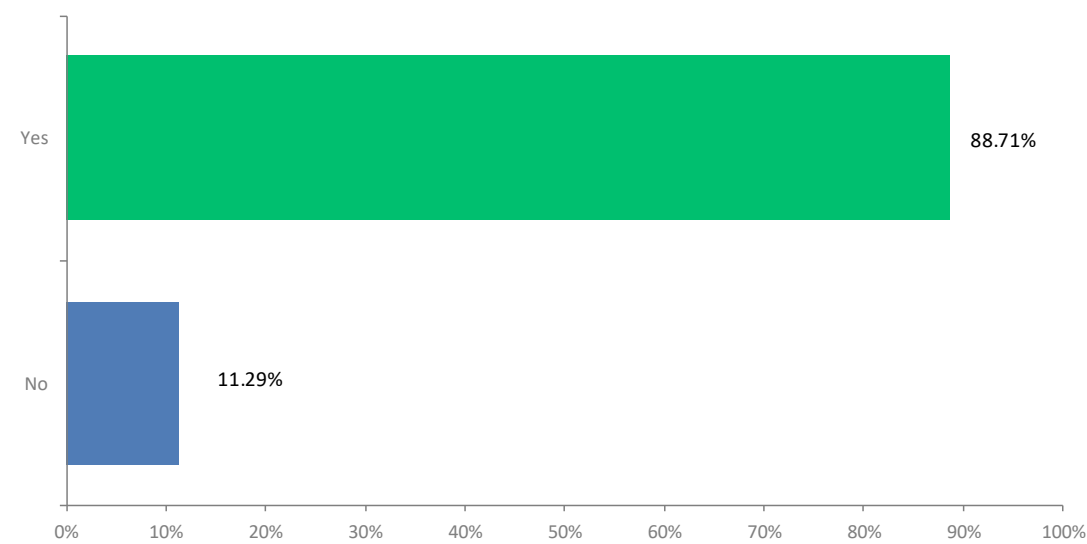
Q19: Should there be an entrance at Shorncliffe Way for pedestrians?

Q20: Should we make new all-weather paths in the park?

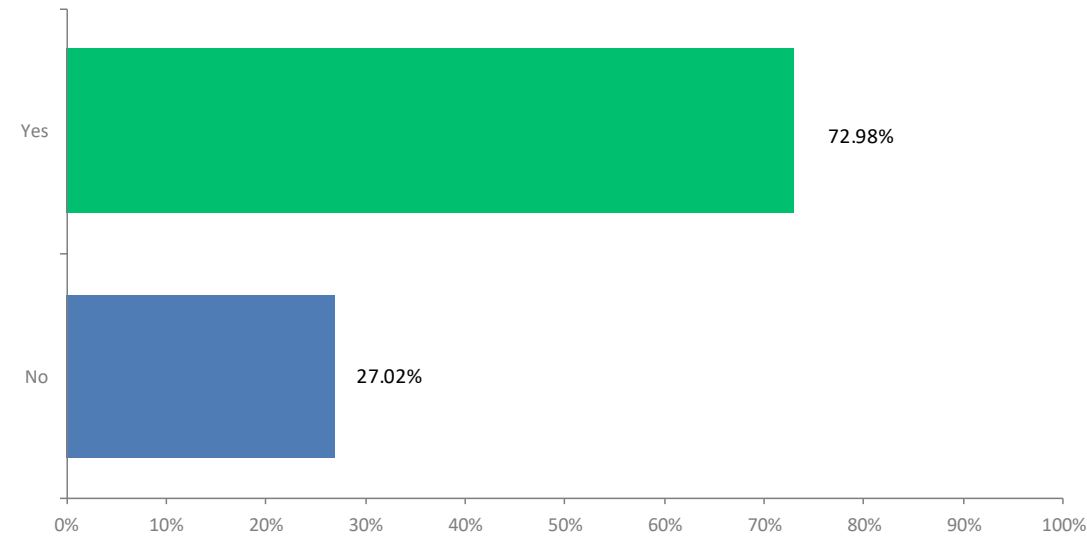

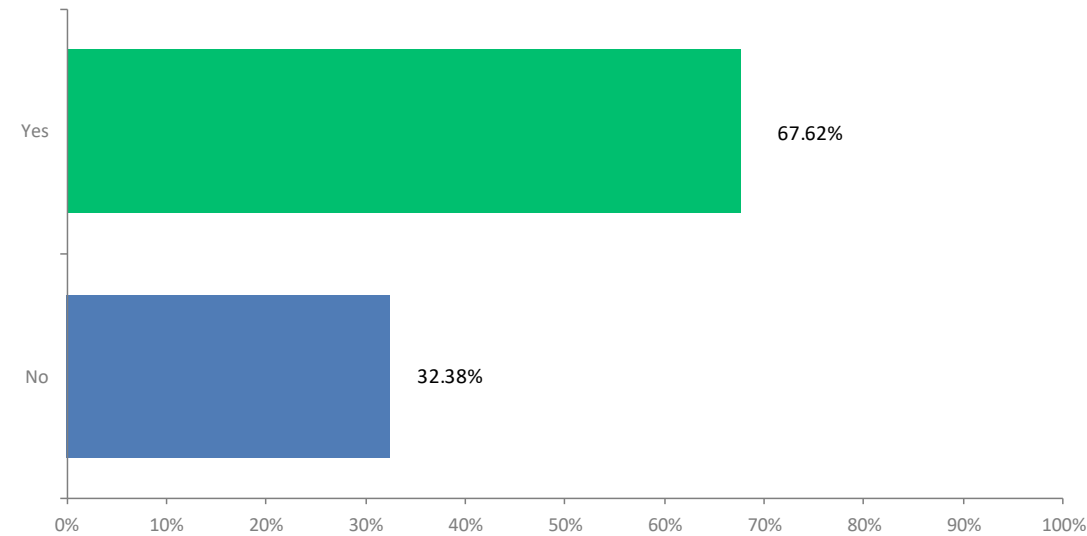
Q21: Should the main paths have lighting?

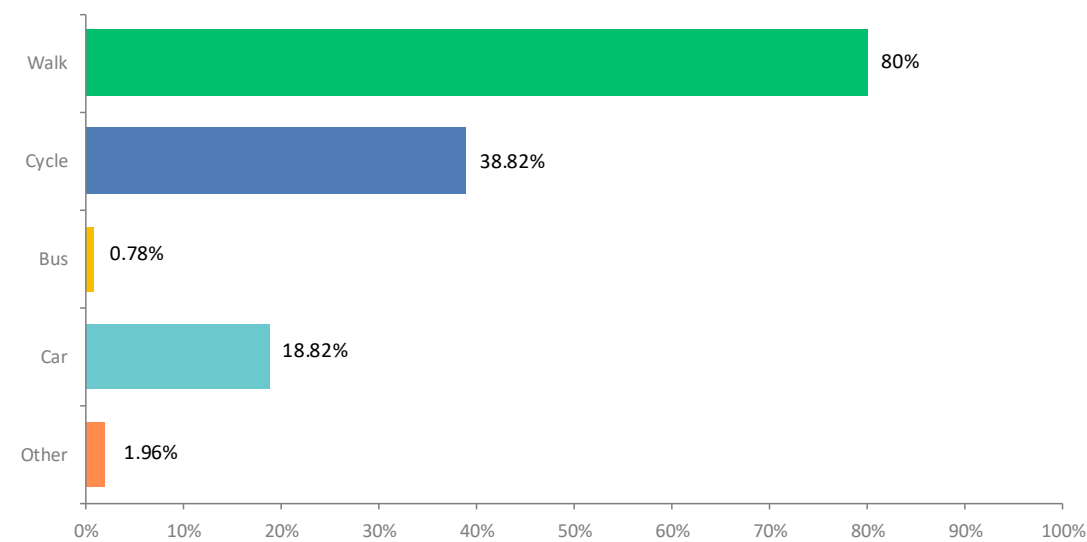
Q26: Do we need public parking?

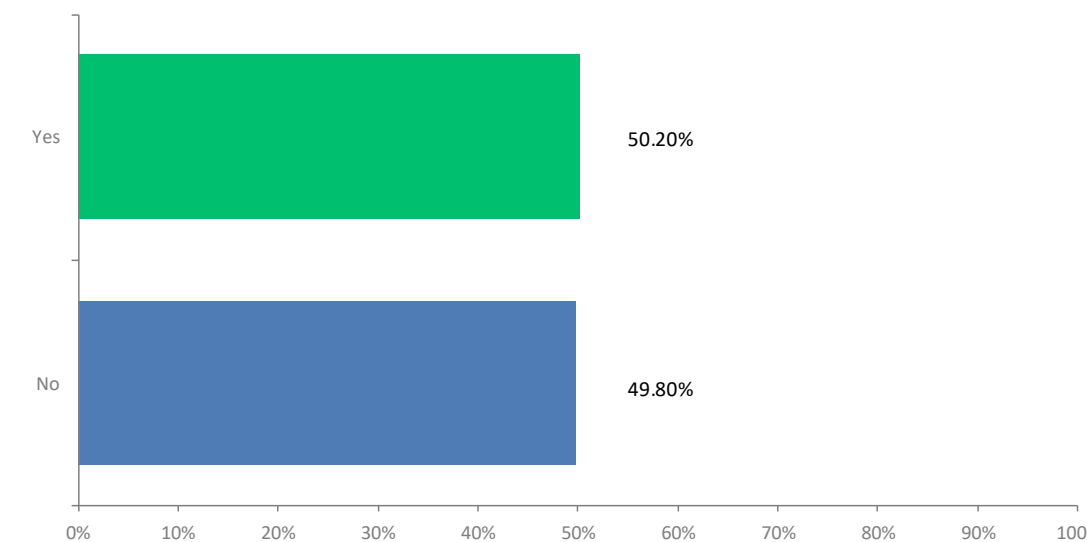
Q27: How do you travel to Shorncliffe Rec

Q28: Do you think the park is accessible to all?

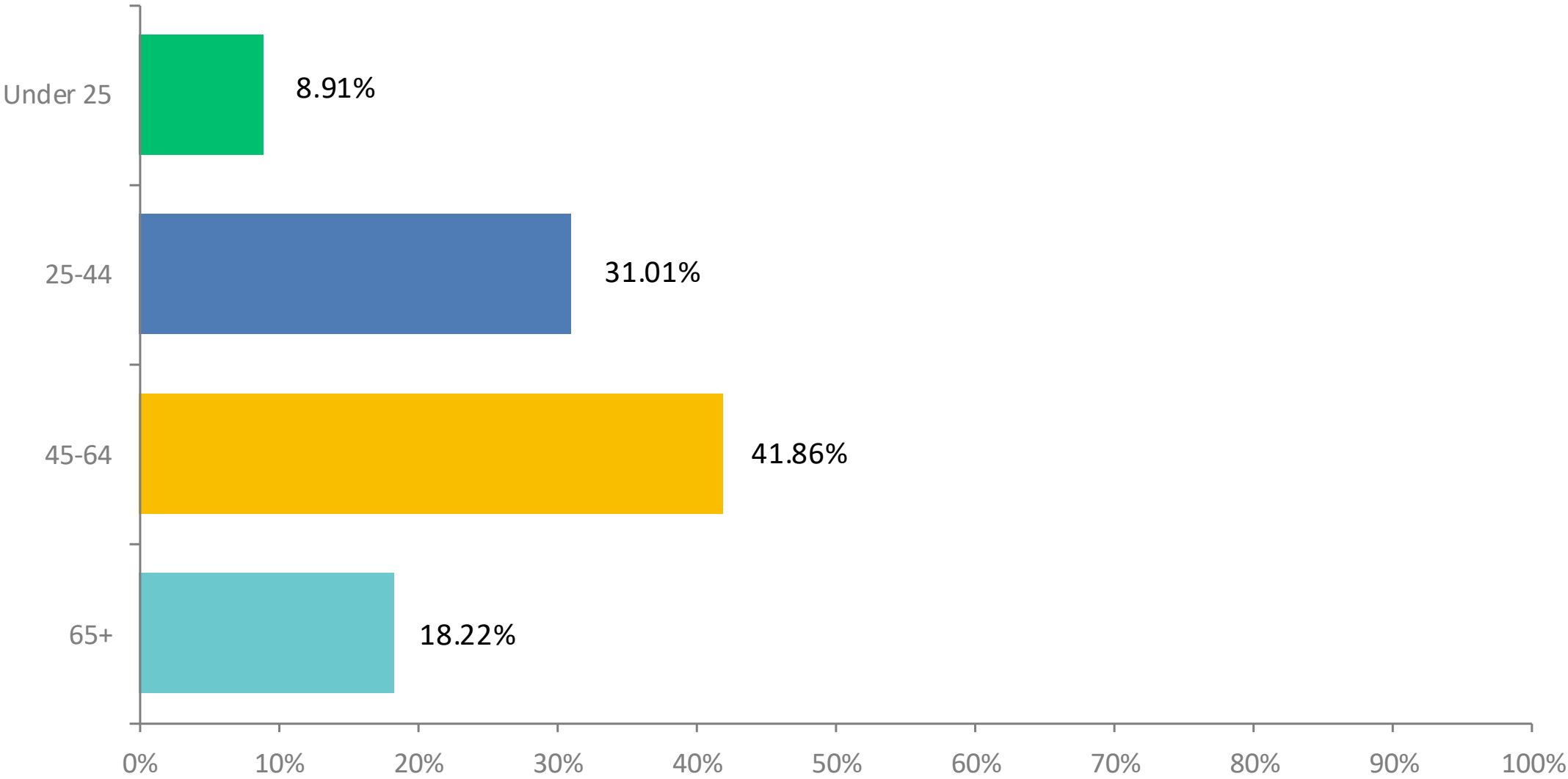

General Key Observations by STC/Camlins Team Wednesday 25 February

- Dog walkers were present consistently throughout the day, from 8am to 6pm, we assume also before and after these times. These are clearly one of the key groups of people using the space.
- For the first few hours of the morning, there were a number of adults with pre-school children, which was particularly noticeable given the lack of any facilities aimed at this young age group.
- After school hours, a large number of children, essentially unaccompanied teenagers, enjoyed using the site, particularly the pump track, but also the multi-use games area.
- The nearest place to purchase food and drink is the Co-op on Mytton Oak Road, min. 10 minute walk from the site.
- The whole green space was almost entirely free of litter. A number of people confirmed that they, or others, regularly collected litter, swept up broke glass. One person had even picked up dog poo left by others.
- People did mention that anti-social behaviour had been a problem in the past, but generally people were well behaved and the green space was great resource for young people.
- Many people mentioned that access by travellers had been a problem on several past occasions, and supported physical measures to prevent this from happening.
- The majority of people who took part were aware of the engagement and visited the space on the day for that purpose, although a large minority were just present as part of their normal routines.
- There was one organised group from Shorncliffe Way / Shorncliffe Drive, circa. 15 people. That was very helpful and our impression of their views is given below [to be attached]. They said they would forward a written response by email.
- Overall we felt that there was a great deal of positive interest. Every single consultee expressed that there was, at least, some merit in STC investing in the park, although this was often accompanied by an insistence that proper future management / maintenance of the space was essential, and was the potential weak point in any long term plan. Most people were supportive, full of ideas and keen to see the next stage proposals

General Key Observations by STC/Camlins Team Sunday 1 March

- The grass football pitch is a valuable resource, presumably cannot be too heavily used so it does not become worn out.
- There are no seats, covered areas or any other facilities for players or spectators.
- There is a strong community element to the football played here, with this SAHA u16s team being mostly together since 4th form.
- Our final observation was that after the football game finished there were no places for the team to sit, relax, or rest. There were also no facilities where they could get food/ drinks or freshen up, so the players left the site and went home immediately rather than staying for longer.
- The pump track and MUGA were well used throughout this period of the day.
- It was not raining, but the weather was quite windy and cold at times, so we would expect general use of the space on Sunday afternoons could be much higher at other times of the year.

Camlin
