TEAM SHREWSBURY – POLICING PRIORITIES

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To receive an update on the Local Policing Charter.

LOCAL POLICING CHARTER

West Mercia Police developed its Local Policing Charter in 2021 designed to engage with the community in determining the local priorities for an area.

The Charter required all Parish & Town Councils to submit 3 policing priorities for their area for the Police to focus on over a 3-month period. Given that Shrewsbury in effect covers 17 divisions of Shropshire Council 3 separate priorities were allowed per ward.

The Superintendent has routinely invited Parish Clerks to meetings to discuss the general principles of the Charter. It soon became evident that a 3-month turnaround of priorities wasn't possible, so priorities now stay in place for 6 months. On that basis a revision to the Local Policing Charter is appended to this report.

The Town Clerk has discussed the new Local Policing Charter with the Safe Neighbourhood Team Inspector. He continues to be keen that the Council engages with the process but has asked that priorities need to be more specific to allow outcomes to be achieved. This message was communicated to members when developing the September submission list. Ongoing discussions will take place with the SNT Inspector to determine how best feedback to the Council on outcomes.

Column	Traffic-related concerns. London, Wenlock and Sutton roads each have narrow sections that are a major concern when traffic is too fast. There are further concerns about the recent (? Lockdown?) phenomenon of late-night racing. Many of us in Shrewsbury must hear this going on in the dead of night. Every now and then a WM speed van is situated on London Rd opposite SCAT – where the speed limit coming into town drops from 40 to 30 mph.
