Through this consultation, Defra is seeking as wide a range of views as possible to support our decision on whether the 27 proposed sites should be added to the list of designated bathing waters in England, in line with the requirements of the Bathing Water Regulations 2013 and the application criteria and evidence requirements published at <u>Bathing waters:</u> apply to designate or de-designate - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk).

This year, as well as asking respondents whether they agree, disagree or are neutral about a proposed designation, we are also asking questions about the facilities or infrastructure at or near each site. This could include things like, for example, parking or changing facilities, or infrastructure such as water company assets or farming infrastructure.
