

**PUBLIC PATH STOPPING UP
AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER
TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990, SECTION 257
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 53(A)(2)**

**THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 74 (PART) TOWN OF
SHREWSBURY) PUBLIC PATH STOPPING UP ORDER 2026**

This order is made by the Shropshire Council ("the Council") under section 257 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 because it is satisfied that it is necessary to stop up the Footpath to which this order relates in order to enable development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 seeking approval for a Reserved Matters planning application for a residential development on land to the south of Oteley Road and west of Thrower Road, Shrewsbury, under planning reference 25/04361/REM and approval for layout, scale, appearance and landscaping for 226 dwellings pursuant to outline planning permission 24/02907/OUT.

This order is also made under section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the 1981 Act") because it appears to the authority that the Shropshire definitive map and statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(a)(i) of the 1981 Act, namely, the stopping up (as authorised by this order) of a highway hitherto shown or required to be shown in the map and statement.

BY THIS ORDER:

1. The Footpath over the land shown by a bold black line on the attached map and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this order ("the Schedule") shall be stopped up, and the Shropshire definitive map and statement shall be modified as provided below.

The stopping up of the Footpath shall have effect on the date on which Shropshire Council confirm the order, and upon occurrence of that stopping up the Shropshire definitive map shall be modified by deleting from it the path or way referred to in paragraph 1 of this order, and the definitive statement shall be modified as described in Part 2 of the schedule.

2. Where immediately before the date on which the footpaths are stopped up there is apparatus under, in, on, over, along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.

PART I

Description of site of existing path or way

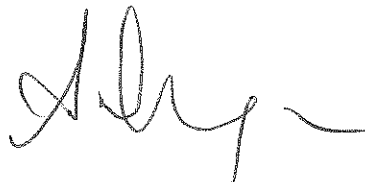
The full width of that part of 74 to be stopped up leaves point A on the Order map at grid reference SJ 4959 1009 running in a southerly direction to point B on the Order map at grid reference SJ 4959 1008 A distance of approximately 5 metres.

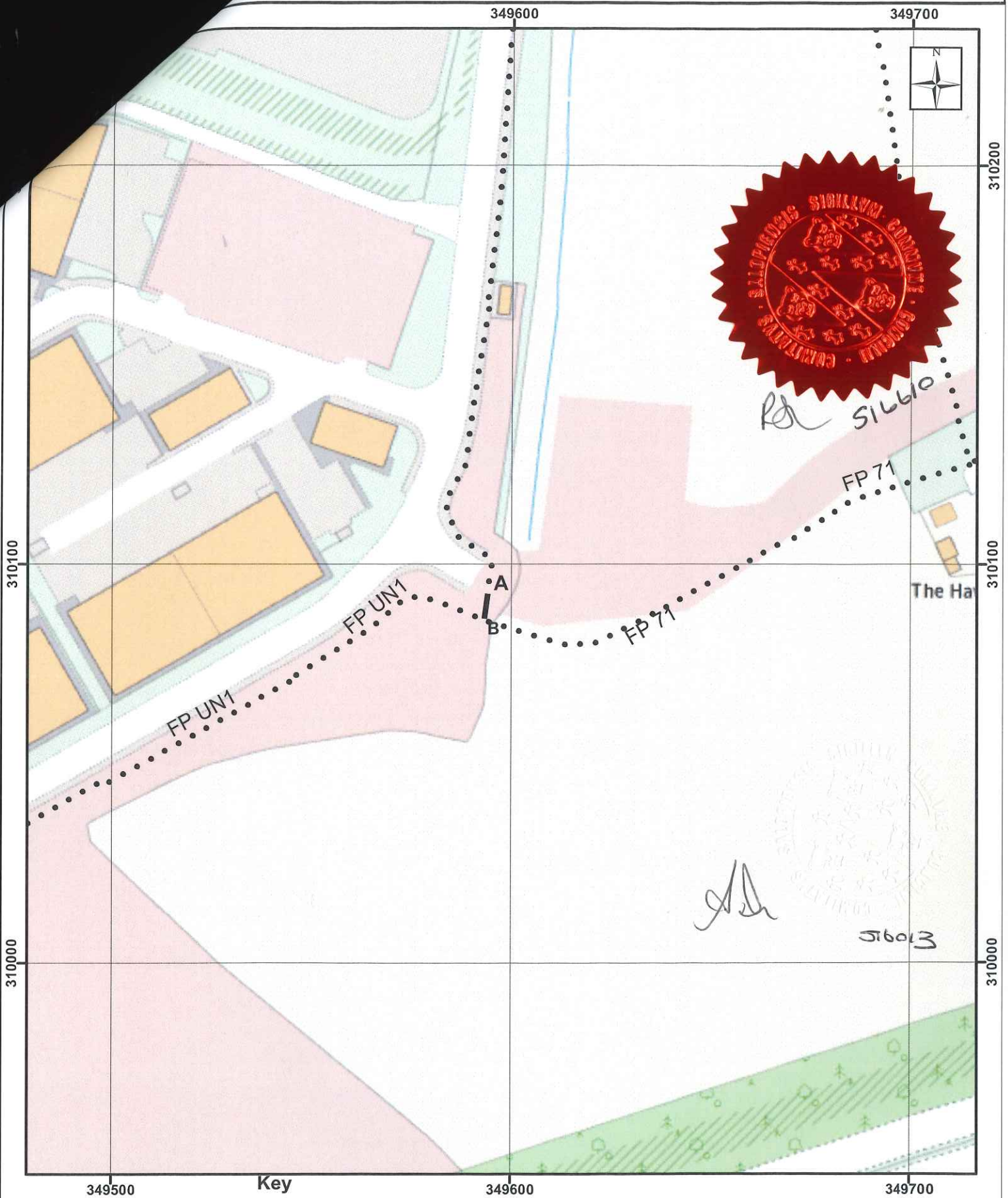
