THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2011 (AMENDMENT NO. 2) ORDER 2018

On 15 November 2018 Shropshire Council made an order to make the following amendments to its off-street parking places Order, as it relates to Ludlow and Shrewsbury:

- 1. The provision for Season Tickets in the St Julian's Friars car park in Shrewsbury will be ended;
- 2. Set a new standard banding and new tariff structure for car parks in Ludlow;
- 3. Introduce an 8-hour parking cap in specified car parks in Ludlow;
- 4. Remove all maximum stay and minimum return restrictions in all the car parks in Ludlow;
- 5. Introduce weekly, season and residents' permits in specified car parks in Ludlow;
- 6. Introduce in specified car parks in Ludlow new concessionary tariff rates for parking on Sundays, Bank and Public holidays;
- 7. Provision will be made to allow the proprietor or manager of a hotel, guest house, bed and breakfast, self-catering or holiday let establishment to apply for season tickets for use by their guests in the following car parks in Ludlow: Galdeford Zone A Car Park (Pay and Display), Galdeford Zone B Car Park (Pay and Display), and Smithfield Car Park (HGV and Coach Park) (Pay and Display). All the existing concessions of this type will be revoked;
- 8. Parking permits for market traders will be available for use in the designated parking areas in Galdeford B, Smithfield, and Castle Street car parks in Ludlow. The charges will be as follows:

These changes will come into effect on 19 November 2018.

A copy of the order may be examined during normal office hours (8:45am-5:00pm Monday to Thursday, and 8:45am-4:00pm on Fridays) at Shropshire Council, The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury SY2 6ND.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or any provisions in it, on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks from 15 November 2018, apply for that purpose to the High Court.
