Dr Nigel Baker – As a Shrewsbury-based freelance urban archeologist with more than 30 years experience, Dr Nigel Baker is a historic towns specialist who has carried out exhaustive research into the historic fabric of our county town and is a respected expert in its development. His recent clients have included Historic England and the National Trust. In the summer of 2019, Nigel was lead archeologist at the Shrewsbury Castle dig, working alongside students from University Centre Shrewsbury to shed new light on the castle’s evolution through the centuries and it has been wonderful to see him uncover other treasures at the castle over the last few weeks as past life has been revealed.

Andrew Arrol – As a celebrated architect and expert conservationist and with a life-long experience of historic building repair, Andrew Arrol’s contribution to Shrewsbury’s built environment has been immense. Working with his talented team at Shrewsbury-based Arrol Architects, his projects across Shrewsbury and over the years have included restoration and enhancement of St Alkmund’s Church, Tudor buildings in Mardol, the Old Market Hall, Holy Trinity Church in Meole Brace, The Buttermarket, and the transformation of Royal Salop Infirmary into the Parade Shopping Centre, as well as handsome new-builds at Carline Fields, Riverside Meadow and Century House. His name often crops up in conversation with colleagues across the country as we affectionately refer to his as God Architect to

reflect the fact he is regularly called to give expert advice on many of this country's greatest churches

My Shrewsbury Magazine – My Shrewsbury is more than a magazine; it is a wonderful reflection of all the businesses, organisations, charities and individuals who make this town what it is. The magazine does the great job of promoting and marketing business and stirring the economy in the town. They also build a picture of this town that attracts many tourists and visitors to Shrewsbury.

In three short years My Shrewsbury has fostered long-lasting relationships with their readers and with schools and community groups, and wonderfully reflects the character of our town and the interests of all who live here. Their magazine helps readers connect with their local community, drives business and creates a sense of belonging and civic pride. And in times like these – this is invaluable.

DM Recruitment – DM Recruitment was founded by Stuart Danks less than 5 years ago, but in that time it has grown from its headquarters in Shrewsbury, to having branches in Welshpool, Cannock and Leominster. Over the last few years the business has grown from a business from home to having its own purpose built offices which has given it the resources to develop the Shropshire Think Tank and establish events like the Shropshire Biz-Fest a networking event that brings professionals together to connect, collaborate and grown their business connections. Even though in the serious world of business their overriding mantra continues to be FUN.

La Bonne Parisienne – A Shropshire girl born and bred with a love of baking that was inspired by her grandmother who was an accomplished professional cookery demonstrator, as well as her own mother who taught her all the basics from a very young age, Alison Jones has been able to turn her hobby into a job and has been operating under the glamorous title of La Bonne Parisienne. What makes this quirky and attractive to many is that the breads and pastries she beautifully prepares are delivered to your doorstep on a bike.

Susan Caroline, Pengwern Books – Now located on Fish Street in the heart of the town after many years in the Market Hall, Pengwern Books has been serving book lovers in Shrewsbury and

beyond for over 13 years. With a small but carefully curated stock, readers will find something different from the mainstream on the shelves and what isn't on the shelf can be ordered quickly. But more importantly Pengwern offers a first class browsing experience. Browsing is something that on line retailers and the big chains just don't do as well, if at all, and Pengwern Books is especially good at it! ... Really putting that personal touch into the love of the written word.

Shrewsbury Shopping Centres – Attracting over 8million visitors in 2019 the Pride Hill and Darwin Shopping Centres are at the heart of the Shrewsbury community and as a result have been collectively branded 'Shrewsbury Shopping' in a bid to create a sense of local pride, bolster their value within the town and provide visitors with a clear locator to navigate by. Their multi-level marketing, events and PR strategy, demonstrating huge investment in the town's commercial and public community, as well as numerous achievements throughout 2019 make them a key business in the town. At a time when retail is on the cusp of survival Shrewsbury Shopping has also introduced a number of new businesses to the town to enhance Shrewsbury's shopping offer, including JD Sports, Meg Hawkins, Teresa's Boutique, Green Options and Skechers – all of which have opened up in Shrewsbury in the last 18 months.
