ANNEX 1

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

For the supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Exhibition of films

For all premises licences and club premises certificates authorising the exhibition of films, access will be restricted only to those who meet the required age limit in line with any certificate granted by the British Board of Film Classification.

Admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with the recommendations given to films by a body designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification is the only body so designated.

Door supervision

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Mandatory Drinks Code Conditions

1. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children:
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted

fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on:
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
4. (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
5. The responsible person shall ensure that:
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH OPERATING SCHEDULE

General

1. All public toilet facilities will be open during large events;
2. Responsible Authorities will be notified where more than 500 people are involved i.e. Safety Advisory Group.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

1. The Town Warden/Council Officers will conduct regular patrols;
2. All persons wishing to carry out licensable activities will be fully briefed by the Town Council staff and required to sign up to the booking application guidance.

Public Safety

1. There will be health & safety, fire and evacuation risk assessments in place;
2. Follow advice from Police, Fire and Local Authority should the need arise.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

1. Noise levels from regulated entertainment will be kept to a minimum so as not to cause a nuisance with procedures in place should the levels need to be reduced;
2. The number of events will be limited to ten per year;
3. Arrangements will be in place for litter collection and removal.

Protection of Children from Harm

1. All children's entertainers will be CRB checked.

ANNEX 3

CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

Conditions attached as resolved at the hearing on 18 July 2012:

1. No licensable activity will take place without the prior written consent of the relevant landowner which shall be obtained in all cases and for all activities.
2. Prior to any licensable activity taking place the licence holder shall consult on the proposals with the Group Manager, Public Protection and Enforcement of Shropshire Council.
